

## HONORS

### Honor Rolls

The purpose of honor rolls is to recognize and encourage quality student performance. Since educational goals include academics and behavior, both are reflected on the honor rolls.

### Grades 3-5

- **A Honor Roll** - No grade less than A, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E on conduct.
- **B Honor Roll** - No grade less than B, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E, or Unsatisfactory on conduct.
- **Principal's List** - B average with no grade less than C, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E, or Unsatisfactory on conduct.

### Grades 6-12

- **A Honor Roll** - No grade less than A-, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E, or Unsatisfactory on conduct.
- **B Honor Roll** - No grade less than B-, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E, or Unsatisfactory on conduct.
- **Principal's List** - - B- average with no grade less than C, no grade of Unsatisfactory for a subject, no grade of D or E, or Unsatisfactory on conduct.

### Valedictorian, Salutatorian, Junior Marshals

- Beginning with the Class of 1999, the weighting system used for the statewide electronic transcript will be used to calculate these honors.
- Beginning with the Class of 1999, students not taking a full load of credit-bearing courses for all four years will be ineligible for these honors.
