SCHOOL PROFILE: 2018-2019

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The Caldwell County School System is a nationally accredited public school district enrolling 12,066 students in grades K-12. The community is part of the Unifour area of North Carolina which has a population of over 400,000. The district includes 6 high schools: 3 traditional high schools, an alternative school, and 2 innovative high schools located on the community college campus. There are 12 elementary schools for students in grades K-5, 4 middle schools serving grades 6-8, and 4 K-8 schools positioned in the scenic, rural areas of Caldwell County.

South Caldwell High School is located on a 100 acre campus in southern Caldwell County & serves approximately 1,430 students in grades 9-12. Students come from a rural community of families who work mainly in the manufacturing & service industries. South Caldwell High School utilizes 4x4 Block Scheduling and each student attends 4 classes daily for an entire semester. Credits are awarded after the end of each semester grading period. In addition to 4 classes, students also participate in a 1-hour SmartLunch. During this time, students are invited to engage in various clubs and activities, attend tutoring sessions, and eat lunch with other students & teachers. Our school also assists all 9th grade students in adjusting to high school standards and expectations through the Spartan Academy, which follows a Freshman Academy model.
