Service Is Not...

For-Profit/ Nonprofit

Getting paid for working at a Nonprofit.

Activities at *For-Profit* organizations.

Religious and Faith Based Organizations

Recruitment/ membership building/ teaching about an organization.

Teaching Sunday School, leading youth group

Child-care/ Elder-care/ Human Services

Babysitting for family

Tutoring/coaching/ visiting at *For-Profit* organizations

Soliciting donations for *For-Profit* organizations

School Clubs/ Athletics, Community Organizations, etc

Leading/organizing/ attending club meetings.

Fundraising for a club/team.

Recruitment/ membership building.

Receiving compensation for camps/classes or refereeing.

Animal Advocacy

Volunteering at a *For-Profit* pet store.

Volunteering at a *For-Profit* boarding house/kennel.

Pet-sitting for compensation.

Miscellaneous

Participating/ organizing political protests/rallies.

Volunteering for political candidates/ parties/special interest groups.

Service Is...

Volunteering at local Nonprofits.

Collecting supplies for Nonprofits.

Volunteering in the nursery.

Service projects/Mission Trips where the goal is to improve facilities/structures and grounds/etc.

Babysitting for local Nonprofits without compensation.

Collecting supplies for the Women's Shelter.

Making scarves for a residents at a nursing home.

Volunteering at a local food pantry.

Volunteering to referee/coach games without compensation.

Providing water/snacks for a team you or your family is not associated with.

Participating in a Beta/Interact sponsored service activity.

Working on an Eagle Scout/Gold Award Project.

Collecting supplies needed for a local Nonprofit shelter.

Volunteering at a Nonprofit animal shelter.

Facilitating a fundraising campaign for a Nonprofit shelter.
