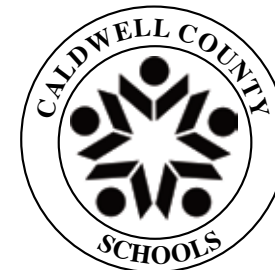

and most rewarding for students.

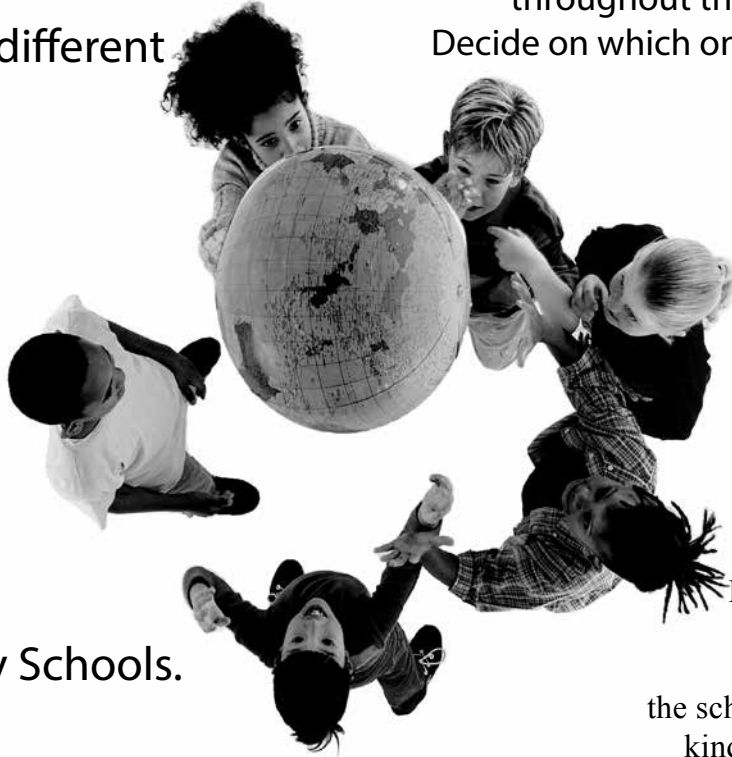

Many volunteer assignments are available throughout the school system. Decide on which one works best for you:


Lunch Buddies
(Grades K-5)
Eat lunch at school with a student at least twice a month and serve as a positive adult role model.


Kindergarten Screening
Be the first to show rising kinders and parents the school campus during kindergarten screening held in the spring.


 **Test Proctor**
Observe students as they take state mandated tests.


 **Chaperone**
Accompany students on field trips or special activities (overnight trips/activities require a criminal background check).


 **Reading Partner**
Listen to a student read and help with basic comprehension (tutor training required).


 **Field Day (Grades K-5)**
Enjoy a day outside with the students, while awarding ribbons and clocking times during the competition.


 **Concessions (Grades 6-12)**
Spend a few hours cooking and serving *dogs and burgers* to fans at the game.

 **Teacher Appreciation Week**
Show support for educators and the teaching profession by preparing refreshments and recognizing employees during Teacher Appreciation Week observed in May.

 **Graduation Project (High School)**
Mentor high school students in a specific career field, such as architecture, fashion design, visual arts, engineering, accounting, etc., to assist with a required high school project. Volunteers are also needed to serve as Graduation Project judges.

 **Picture Day (K-5)**
Help teachers ready students for school pictures.

 **Special Events**
Sign up to assist with school events, education awards, concerts, talent shows, holiday programs, and much more!

 **Beautification**
Help beautify a school campus by pulling weeds, mulching or planting flowers.
